Transportation Options in Baltimore

Please exercise a sensible amount of caution when traveling in Baltimore at night. As in other cities, it is safest to travel and wait for public transportation in groups and to be cautious about using smartphones in public. Because Baltimore is much smaller and less populated than other major metropolitan areas, it can actually be easier to be a target of petty crime than it is in New York City.

Please confirm all public transportation options before embarking on a trip.

BWI Marshall Airport Transportation

BWI is approximately 10–15 miles from Baltimore, depending on the route. Driving times vary wildly based on Baltimore-D.C. traffic: plan on 30-45 minutes of driving time, or longer if you take public transportation.

BWI Taxi

The taxi stand is located just outside of the baggage claim area of the Lower Level of the BWI Marshall terminal. Please note that this service is available from BWI Marshall only. For cab service to BWI Marshall, please consult your local cab company. BWI Marshall taxicabs are prohibited from charging flat rates. Light Rail

Light Rail Service is provided by the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) to and from BWI Marshall Airport. A complete service map can be found here: <http://mta.maryland.gov/sites/default/files/Neighborhood-University-CntrLR.pdf>

Light Rail service is available to downtown Baltimore from BWI Marshall Airport. To get to the Lord Baltimore Hotel, the Brookshire Suites, or other hotels in the Inner Harbor, take the BWI/Hunt Valley Line north. Get off at **University Center/Baltimore Street**, at the corner of Baltimore and Howard Street. The fare is \$1.70 each way. **Please note that this trip takes 40-60 minutes, and that the Light Rail comes at twenty-minute intervals on weekdays and half-hour intervals on weekends if it is running on schedule.**

The BWI Marshall Light Rail Station is located immediately outside the lower level of the terminal building, adjacent to Concourse E.

MARC Train

MARC Trains provide service to the BWI Marshall Rail Station, where free shuttles serve the airport terminal. MARC Train service operates seven days a week. Shuttle stops

are located on the lower level terminal roadway in between door numbers 1 & 2, 8 & 9, 14 & 15, and 17 & 18. Shuttle buses from the BWI Marshall terminal building to the rail station operate daily as follows:

5:00 a.m. - 8 p.m. – Every 6 minutes

8 p.m. - 1 a.m. – Every 8 minutes

1 a.m. - 5 a.m. – Every 25 minutes

Buses stop adjacent to the rail station garage, directly in front of the rail station. The BWI Rail Station is located one mile from the terminal building. To contact the BWI Marshall Rail Station, please call 410-672-6169. We estimate that the MARC train may take at least an hour.

The MTA offers a feature known as the MARCTracker which enables passengers to determine the location and status of every operating MARC train. Customers can also call the MTA Customer Call Center Monday through Friday from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. at 866-RIDE-MTA or log onto <http://mta.maryland.gov/marc-train>.

From Baltimore City: You can board MARC trains at Baltimore's Penn Station, which is located at 1500 North Charles Street. Hours and information can be found by Googling Baltimore Penn Station and following the first Amtrak link. To contact Penn Station, please call 410-291-4165.

Train Transportation from Maryland, D.C., and Out-of-State

Amtrak

Numerous Amtrak trains arrive each day at Baltimore's Penn Station, located at 1500 North Charles Street. To get from Penn Station to the Inner Harbor, take the Charm City Circulator Purple Line going south. Catch the circulator at stop 321 (Penn Station – Southbound), located at 1600 St. Paul Street.

For the Lord Baltimore and the Monaco Hotel, get off at stop 328 (Fayette Street) near the intersection of St. Paul & E. Fayette Street. For the Brookshire Suites, get off at stop 329 (Pratt Street – Inner Harbor) near the intersection of Pratt Street & Light Street.

To return to Penn Station, take the Charm City Circulator Purple Line going north. The closest stop to the Lord Baltimore Hotel (and the Hotel Monaco) is stop 304—Fayette Street—which is located near the intersection of E. Fayette & N. Charles Streets. The closest stop to the Brookshire Suites is stop 303—Light Street—which is located at the intersection of E. Redwood Street and Light Street. Disembark at stop 310 (Penn Station – Northbound), located at 1545 N. Charles Street (Penn Station).

MARC Train

The MARC train runs from Washington Union Station to Baltimore Penn Station.

Please note that the MARC's last departure from Penn Station is at 9:15 p.m. every night, so you may want to use a different method to return to Washington, D.C.

We suggest that you use GPS or your phone's map function to navigate to and from wedding venues. Please note that we are offering **free valet parking for all cars**.

From the Lord Baltimore Hotel and the Hotel Monaco

Head east on W. Baltimore Street toward Charles St. Turn right onto Charles and drive north about half a mile. When you come to a traffic circle with a large column in the middle (the George Washington monument), turn right onto Mount Vernon Place. The entrance to the Peabody Library will be immediately on your right.

From the Brookshire Suites

Head west on E. Lombard St toward Grant St. Turn right onto Charles Street and drive north about half a mile. When you come to a traffic circle with a large column in the middle (the George Washington monument), turn right onto Mount Vernon Place. The entrance to the Peabody Library will be immediately on your right.

From the North

Take I-83 south to Maryland Avenue/Exit 5. Turn left onto Maryland Avenue. After .3 miles, keep straight as the street curves a bit to the right and then left, becoming Cathedral Street. After another .3 miles, turn left onto Mount Vernon Place. The entrance to the Peabody Library will be on your right, immediately after N. Charles St.

From the West & South

Take I-95 north from the Baltimore Beltway (I-695). Take I-395 N/Exit 53 toward Downtown/Inner Harbor. Take I-395 north for about a mile and turn right onto W. Conway Street. Turn left at the second light onto Charles Street and drive north about a mile. When you come to a traffic circle with a large column in the middle (the George Washington monument), turn right onto Mount Vernon Place. The entrance to the Peabody Library will be immediately on your right.

From the East

Take US-40 W into Baltimore. Turn right onto N. Charles Street and drive three blocks north. When you come to a traffic circle with a large column in the middle (the George Washington monument), turn right onto Mount Vernon Place. The entrance to the Peabody Library will be immediately on your right.

Parking

A valet will be available to take your car at the entrance to the Peabody Library. Parking in the neighborhood can be difficult and many spots are subject to time restrictions.

Taxis/Public Transportation to the Peabody Library

The Peabody Library is approximately .8 miles from the Lord Baltimore Hotel and 1 mile from the Brookshire Suites. We suggest picking up a taxi outside your hotel or asking the front desk for assistance in securing one.

Alternately, you may catch Baltimore's **free** tourist bus, the Charm City Circulator, which runs every **10-15 minutes**. You will want to get the **Purple Line** going north. The closest stop to the Lord Baltimore Hotel (and the Hotel Monaco) is stop 304—Fayette Street—which is located near the intersection of E. Fayette & N. Charles Streets. The closest stop to the Brookshire Suites is stop 303—Light Street—which is located at the intersection of E. Redwood Street and Light Street.

Get off the circulator at stop 307 (Washington Monument) at the corner of N. Charles Street & E. Mount Vernon Place. Turn right onto E. Mount Vernon Place, and walk halfway down the block. The Peabody Library is located at 17 E. Mount Vernon Place on your right.

The Purple Line runs until midnight on Friday and Saturday night. To return to the hotels from the Peabody, catch the circulator on St. Paul Street at stop 325 (Center Street) near the intersection of Center Street & St. Paul Street. For the Lord Baltimore and the Monaco Hotel, get off at stop 328 (Fayette Street) near the intersection of St. Paul & E. Fayette Street. For the Brookshire Suites, get off at stop 329 (Pratt Street – Inner Harbor) near the intersection of Pratt Street & Light Street.

We suggest that you use GPS or your phone's map function to navigate to and from wedding venues. **Parking at the BMI is free and plentiful in its private lot.** Please make sure that you use the correct gate to enter (there is a sign). Please exit through the other gate—the one next to the museum and nearest the industrial crane with the American flag. Weather permitting, **the wedding ceremony will be held outside on the terrace overlooking the water;** please dress accordingly.

From the Lord Baltimore Hotel and the Hotel Monaco

Head east on W. Baltimore Street toward Light Street. Turn right at the second cross street onto Light. After about a half mile, move into the far left-hand lane and make a left onto Key Highway. In a little less than a mile, the BMI will be on the left.

From the Brookshire Suites

Head west on E. Lombard Street toward Light Street. Turn left onto Light. After about a half mile, move into the far left-hand lane and make a left onto Key Highway. In a little less than a mile, the BMI will be on the left.

From the North

Take I-83 south to Lombard Street. Turn right onto Lombard. After half a mile, turn left onto Light Street. After about a half mile, move into the far left-hand lane and make a left onto Key Highway. In a little less than a mile, the BMI will be on the left.

From the West & South

Take I-95 north from the Baltimore Beltway (I-695). Take Key Highway/Exit 55. Take a left at the light. Go under the overpass and take a left onto Key Highway. The BMI is on the right just past the third light at the intersection of Lawrence Street.

From the East

Take I-95 south through Fort McHenry Tunnel. Stay in the right lane of the right tube. Take Key Highway/Exit 55. Turn right at the light onto Key Highway. The BMI is on the right just past the third light at the intersection of Lawrence Street.

Taxis/Public Transportation to the Baltimore Museum of Industry

The Baltimore Museum of Industry is approximately 2 miles from the wedding hotels. We suggest picking up a taxi outside your hotel or asking the front desk for assistance in securing one.

From either hotel, catch the **Banner Line** Charm City Circulator at stop 420 (Pratt Street) near the intersection of Pratt & Light Street.

Coming back from the museum, catch the circulator from stop 415 (Baltimore Museum of Industry) near the intersection of Key Highway & Boyle Street. Get off at stop 420 (Pratt Street).

The Banner Line runs every **15-20 minutes** until midnight on Friday and Saturday. If you are taking public transportation to the wedding, please leave with sufficient time to make it to your seat by 5:30 p.m.; the ceremony will begin on time.

Taxi and Uber Information

Please be aware that surge pricing may be in effect for Uber/Lyft on Halloween night. On Halloween night 2014, for example, Uber surge pricing (9x typical cost) resulted in a \$362 20-minute cab ride for one local woman.

Fun Things to Do in Baltimore

Baltimore is full of interesting attractions. Here, we've listed some of the most popular spots in the city, many of them in or close to the Inner Harbor. But this city of 600,000 people stretches out for 92 square miles and is home to many other fascinating attractions, including scenic parks (several designed by Frederick Law Olmsted, Jr.), one-of-a-kind shops, and historic markets. Look online for additional travel tips: Baltimore City Paper's Best of Baltimore issues can be especially helpful.

We suggest taking the **free Charm City Circulator** to get around. The **Purple Line** runs to Mount Vernon, Penn Station, Station North, and Charles Village; the **Banner Line** runs to the American Visionary Art Museum; the **Green Line** will take you to the Reginald F. Lewis Museum, Port Discovery, and Fells Point; and the **Orange Line** runs west to the B&O Railroad Museum and Camden Yards, and east to the National Aquarium, the Jewish Museum of Maryland (plus Corned Beef Row), and Little Italy.

Also included in the collection is the Seven Foot Knoll Lighthouse, which marked the entrance to the Patapsco River and Baltimore Harbor for over 130 years.
